Whether you enjoy hiking, walking, biking, or simply sitting in your backyard... knowing how to identify birds will enrich and deepen your outdoor experiences.

In our four-week Beginning Birdwatching class, you'll learn the basics of using binoculars and scopes; good Bay Area spots to find birds; and how to identify different kinds of birds. Fall is a great time to begin, with shorebirds and ducks returning to the Bay and winter-resident land birds coming back from the mountains.
