A Mammal is a kind of Animal Most other Animals don't feed their babies milk

All Mammals feed their babies milk

Carnivore - eats Herbivore - eats **Omnivore - eats** 

Active Crepuscular = Dawn + Dusk

Active Nocturnal = Night

Active Diurnal = in **Daytime**

Most Animals are sensitive. Being quiet and listening is important when looking for animals.

Audubon reccomends: keeping all pet cats indoors. Build a "Catio", or at least put a bell on your cat. Cats are major predators of small wildlife and birds.

Bats need a healthy insect

population to survive.

Bats and moths are animals. Which one is a carnivore?

Try to get your parents or another adult in your family to take you to the Park. You might see a squirrel. Squirrels are omnivores.

Look under old wood and rocks for insects or maybe even a newt or salamander! But remember to place rocks and wood back carefully, the way vou found it so that animals can continue

to live safely and reproduce.



Frog **Animal Amphibian** Ectothermic = gets heat from **Environment** 



**Mammal** Endothermic = gets heat from what it eats

All mammals are Endothermic.
