

How do I find Animals? (which are different from "Mammals")

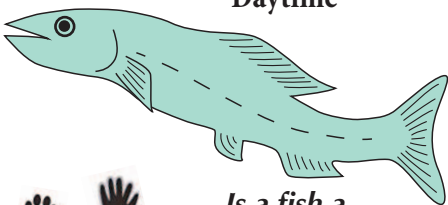
A Mammal is a kind of Animal

Crepuscular = Active at Dawn + Dusk

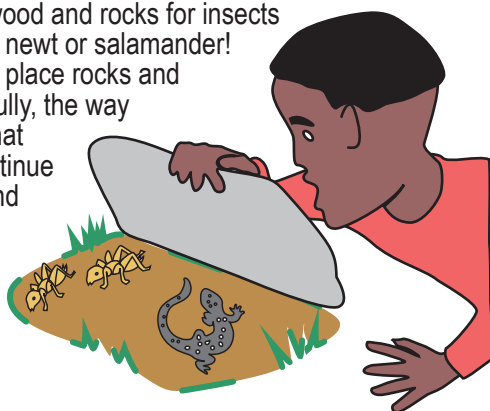
Nocturnal = Active at Night

Diurnal = Active in Daytime



Is a fish a Vertebrate or a Invertebrate?

Look under old wood and rocks for insects or maybe even a newt or salamander! But remember to place rocks and wood back carefully, the way you found it so that animals can continue to live safely and reproduce.



Vertebrate = Backbone
Invertebrate = No Backbone

If you use a red plastic film over your flashlight the red light it makes doesn't bother the mammals as much.



Most Animals are sensitive. Being quiet and listening is important when looking for animals.

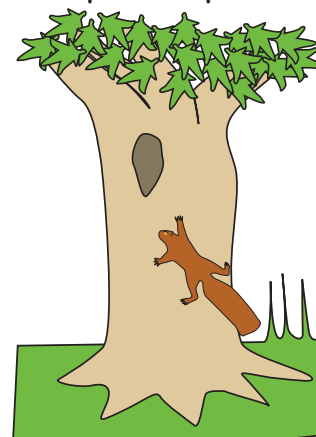
Audubon recommends: keeping all pet cats indoors. Build a "Catio", or at least put a bell on your cat. Cats are major predators of small wildlife and birds.

Try to get your parents or another adult in your family to take you to the Park. You might see a squirrel. Squirrels are omnivores.
