Information About Golden Gate Bird Alliance Adult Education Classes

Golden Gate Bird Alliance offers classes in Fall, Winter, and Spring with the most offerings in Fall. Classes are generally 4-6 weeks with a 1-2 hour weeknight presentation and 3-4 hour weekend field trip each week. Most weeknight class presentations are through Zoom. Exact timing and dates of classes, in-person or Zoom presentation modality, presentation recording, and the locations of presentations and field trips vary by class, but will be posted in the class offerings during the enrollment periods. Class levels vary from entry level beginning birding to more advanced topics. See below for the list of possible 2024 class offerings.

In addition to the seasonal short-classes, Golden Gate Bird Alliance in partnership with the California Academy of Sciences offers the year-long <u>Master Birder Program</u>. Enrollment for Master Birder begins in late 2023 and the program begins in February, meeting twice monthly through December. The program is taught by Jack Dumbacher, Curator of Ornithology and Mammalogy at the California Academy of Sciences, Bruce Mast, and Eddie Bartley.
