## **Golden Gate Bird Alliance Adult Education Classes**

Golden Gate Bird Alliance offers classes each season in fall, winter, spring, and summer with the most offerings in fall. Classes are generally 4-6 weeks. The structures vary but most are a 1-2 hour weeknight presentation paired with a 3-4 hour weekend field trip each week. Most weeknight class presentations are through Zoom. Exact dates of classes, presentation modality, recording availability, and the locations of field trips vary by class, but these details will be posted in the class offerings during the enrollment periods. Class levels vary from entry level beginning birding to more advanced topics. See below for the list of possible class offerings.
