Visit a park or walk down your street. Look and listen for birds. When you see one:

Activities for home (or during your walk):

- Draw the bird.
- Make up a story about the bird. From what you can see, what might it be doing – looking for food, defending its territory, trying to attract a mate, building a nest, taking a rest, or ?????? If it's looking for food, what kind of food do you think it eats?
- Name that bird! Download the free **Merlin** app from Cornell Lab of Ornithology to your cellphone or go to allaboutbirds.org on your computer. Input the information you wrote down, and Merlin will show you names and photos to help you figure out what species of bird you saw.
